

## From the President

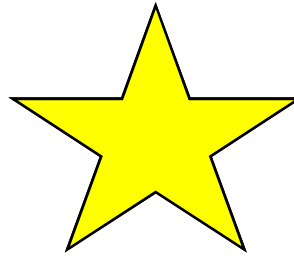
